

Distributed Generation Statistics

As at 5 August 2013

Part 6 of the Electricity Industry Participation Code 2010 mandates the application and approval process between the prospective generator and the distributor (i.e. the network operator).

One of the specific obligations on distributors is annual reporting of statistics pertaining to connection of distributed generation. The graphs attached to this document are the aggregated result of that reporting from distributors.

Notes:

- The 2007 year is in fact only from 30 August 2007 till 31 December 2007
- The 2009 year includes one 35MW connection (Tauhara). The relevant distributor is Unison
- The 2010 year includes one 64MW connection (Te Uku). The relevant distributor is WEL networks.
- The 2011 year includes one 30MW connection (Mahinerangi Wind Farm). The relevant distributor is Aurora Energy.
- A connection that is applied for in any given year and is connected after the relevant distributor has provided their reporting on that given year shows up in the 'Application Success Rates' chart only. Therefore, as a measure of nameplate capacity and connection growth of all distributed generation in New Zealand, the figures are understated. Since 2007, there have been 121 connections (9 in 2008, 8 in 2009, 7 in 2010, 17 in 2011, 80 in 2012) approved that were not connected at the time of reporting. The connection status and characteristics associated with those 121 connections is unknown.
